



Rachel Coldsmith: Missions Trip

During the second week of November, I had the opportunity to travel to Yamaranguila, Honduras with a small group of individuals. Our trip started in San Pedro Sula, Honduras. San Pedro Sula has the highest murder rate in the world. This explained the soldiers everywhere and armed guard towers at the airport.

We then took a four hour bus ride to the La Esperanza, Honduras. During this bus ride I was able to see firsthand the poverty of a third world country. All over the countryside I saw tiny shacks with thin tin roofs. Every "house" had some sort of fence around it, whether it be sticks, cinder blocks or barbed wire. There were stray dogs everywhere, as well as wondering skinny horses and cows.

Seeing severe poverty through a bus window made me very nervous right off the bat. However, when we arrived at the orphanage we were greeted with hugs and smiles which made me feel a little more comfortable with where I was staying.

The orphanage where we were staying was an all girls Christian orphanage with ages 2 years to 18. The name of the orphanage is Project Tabitha Cumi, which comes from a bible verse meaning "Rise up little girls." While we were there we did many things for the orphanage. We put a roof on their play house, built four full size picnic tables, installed a flag pole at their school and helped prepare food. In between our service, and the girl's time at school, we played games and bonded with the girls. We ate all of our meals with them as well which consisted of black beans and rice everyday.

One of the days we were there we took a 2 hour hike through the mountain to a school. With us we brought water bottles full of toys and school supplies, as well as small lunches. When we arrived at the school we handed these things to the children and it put huge smiles on their faces. Seeing their smiles made the hike and all the work completely worth it.

We took the bottles of supplies and lunches to two other schools, as well as soccer goals that we made and old Shippensburg University jerseys. The children at all of the schools we went to were extremely poor and many of them didn't have shoes. We were informed by one of the teachers at a school called La Salidad, that the lunches we brought the kids was most likely the only thing they would eat that day. This explained why many of them didn't eat it, but rather saved it to bring home for their family.

Monthly Passage

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

I learned a lot from this trip both intellectually and spiritually. It was a great chance to explore my love for Spanish as well as experience school in a third world country. However, I learned more about myself and my walk with God. Seeing how little some people have, showed me how much I really have. I learned how much I really take for granted, as well as how important it is to serve others. Thanks for all the prayers and support!
