August Spiritual Exercise

This exercise has three parts: 1) Take notes from a sermon from Roxbury Holiness Camp. Changes to Roxbury Camp

Roxbury 2020 - COVID-19 Protocols

WE are living in an uncertain time, and every one of us has an opinion about COVID-19. As we come together for Camp Meeting this year, we encourage everyone to respond to this situation as The Body of Christ and follow what Scripture teaches us.

How we choose to live as individuals is a personal choice and a matter of personal conscience. In light of Scripture, how we live in community may necessitate how each of us responds to the best interest of others, even though we may not live that way in our private lives.

The authorities that govern our state have mandated that all individuals older than 2 years of age should wear a facial covering when a social distance of 6 feet cannot be maintained from those who do not live in our household, unless there is a safety or health concern.

In light of these mandates, masks will be

required in all indoor public gathering areas, except for health and safety reasons. This will include meal lines, public restrooms, and the tabernacle. The leadership team strongly encourages each camper to respect the personal space of others; and, when moving through places where social distancing is not possible—regardless of an indoor or outdoor setting—consider a face covering of some type.

More importantly, we were able to show God's love to this community, and that people still care for one another. Many of our guests, while picking up meals shared some small talk or a prayer request with a staff member. Their positive response to this program was equally a blessing to us.

School Kits for MCC

Notebooks and pencils are treasures for families who struggle to afford basic school supplies. School kits are often requested after disasters and help bring normalcy to children whose families have been forced to flee their homes. Last year, 79,557 kits were shipped to Jordan, Lebanon, South Sudan, Syria, Ukraine, and the U.S.

There is a shortage of these kits at the present time. We will be collecting the school supplies to make these kits. The collection dates will be from August 2 to 23. We will be making bags to put the items in on Wednesday, August 19 beginning at 6 p.m. in the annex. Then, on Sunday, August 30, the school kits will be put together during the Sunday School time between services.

You may choose as a family unit to purchase one or more complete kits or you may choose to join with others to purchase these kits.

Listed below are the specific items needed. All items must be new.

- 4 spiral or perforated-pages notebooks (8.5 in. x 10.5 in. and 70 sheets)
- 8 new unsharpened pencils
- 1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate 30 cm; inch markings optional)
- 12 colored pencils in packaging
- 1 large eraser
- 2 new black or blue ballpoint pens
