Carolyn Arends tells this childhood story in her booklet, “The Universe in 57 Words”:

As a church kid, I love the special Sundays when missionaries on furlough brought reports. There is one visit I’ve never forgotten.

The missionary couple was stationed in what appeared in photos to be a particularly steamy jungle. One day, they told us, an enormous snake – much longer than a man – slithered its way through their front door and into the kitchen of their simple home. Terrified, they ran outside and searched frantically for a local who might know what to do. A machete-wielding neighbor came to the rescue, calmly marching into their house and decapitating the snake with a clean chop.

The neighbor reemerged triumphant and assured the missionaries that the reptile had been defeated. But there was a catch, he warned: It was going to take a while for the snake to realize it was dead.

A snake’s neurology and blood flow are such that it can take considerable time for it to stop moving even after decapitation. For the next several hours, the missionaries were forced to wait outside while the snake thrashed about, smashing furniture and flailing against walls and widows, wreaking havoc until its body finally understood that it no longer had a head.

Sweating in the heat, they felt frustrated but also grateful that the snake’s rampage wouldn’t last forever. At some point they had a mutual epiphany.

I leaned in with the rest of the congregation, queasy and fascinated. “Do you see it?” asked the husband. “Satan is a lot like that big old snake. He’s already been defeated. He just doesn’t know it yet. In the meantime,

he’s going to do some damage. But never forget that he’s a goner.

This year is soon ending, and it sure seems the big old snake has been thrashing around in this world. There is no doubt that we should expect this, after all, Jesus calls him the prince of the world. Plus, we read in 1 John 5:19, “We know that we are children of God, and that the whole world is under the control of the evil one.” Thrash, smash, crash and destruction all describe the work of the evil one - Satan.

Yet, here as we approach Christmas living in this smashmouth world, we may have peace. In a world thrashing with Satan, Isaiah prepared us for the coming Messiah, calling him, “Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace” (Isaiah 9:6). When Jesus was born, the angels announced to the shepherds, “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests.” Jesus then tells his disciples or learners, “I have told you these things so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”

Enjoy Jesus this Christmas. Even in this brutal world, we may have peace as we remain in Jesus. “Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times and in every way. The Lord be with all of you” (2 Thessalonians 3:16).

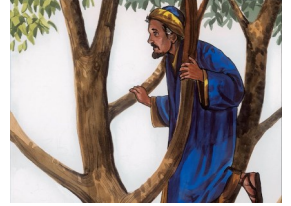
- Motion passed to approve the request from the property managers for \$1.00/hr raise for the custodians.
