Currently, our church board is reading the book The God-centered Church by Henry and Mel Blackaby. Mel Blackaby tells this personal story to inspire us to follow Jesus closely as the head of the church:

I pastored a church in British Columbia, Canada, a place filled with beautiful mountain ranges, trees, and rivers. A member of our church worked for the federal government in the area of water conservation and flood control. One day George asked me if I wanted to go with him to check the readings at one of their remote stations. This was the middle of winter, and the heavy snow had already arrived. So, we loaded up the gear, drove as far as we could go in the truck, and unloaded the two snowmobiles to go the rest of the distance, another forty-five minute ride.

It was a cold January day, but we were prepared. George took off on his machine, and I followed on mine. Now George is not your average man. He had spent most of his career working in harsh, Canadian weather. He had numerous stories of hunting expeditions, and he spent a great deal of time in the backwoods of the mountains. On the drive out there, he laughed as he told me of a dangerous encounter he had with a bear and many other stories that caused me to question whether I ought to be there. Remember, I am a preacher! Where-

as he may have animal heads on his wall, I have educational diplomas hanging on mine.

We were ready. George hit the gas and aggressively raced off into the woods. Still getting used to the snowmobile, I launched out with caution, trying to get the feel of the machine I was riding. I quickly realized that George was leaving me. That, however, was not what caused me the most concern. I saw that some other snowmobiles had been in the area, and there seemed to be a thousand trails going every direction through the woods. The thought crossed my mind, "If I lose George, I will never be seen again! I will never find my way back to civilization!" So, I hit the gas, lowered my head to get more streamlined, leaned into every corner, and kept my eyes firmly fixed on the man I needed to follow. If I were going to die on that day, it would not be from getting lost – though hitting a tree was a very real possibility.

Do you see the lesson God taught me? Many roads lead through life. Others have left trails that lead away from the destination God has for me. As a pastor, I must keep my eyes firmly fixed on Jesus, or I will be hopelessly lost. I must help others see Him and encourage the church to follow Jesus with their whole heart.



FROM THE OBERHOLERS

Hello friends! Here several updates to the prayer requests we sent in May. We've also included several new prayer requests as well.

Updated Prayer Requests:

- After dealing with Strep in our family for several months, the doctor officially declared our home "Strep Free". We recognize that Strep is a minor inconvenience compared to other health issues that some families are currently walking through. Nonetheless, we praise God for his healing hand on our family and we pray for those families still waiting for healing.
- Bekah and the children have 7 more days of school to finish out the current school year. They'll take a week or two break, and then jump right in to getting a head start on the next school year. This schedule provides great flexibility to take days off school throughout the year when other opportunities arise.
- Covid-19 continues to spread throughout the Navajo Nation. Pray that every Navajo person would heed warning from local officials and do what they can to help stop the spread. Pray for families who are losing loved ones. Pray that this virus points people to Jesus in a new, fresh way.
- Several weeks ago we received the anticipated supplies from Colorado. Jason teamed up with several community members to pass out food boxes in Red Valley, a rural community on the Reservation where some people still live without running water or electricity. It was humbling to see how many of the people live, but also a joy to see how grateful they were for a little help. This distribution project has allowed Jason to build some new relationships in the Red Valley community. Pray that these friendships would lead to a movement of house churches in Red Valley and in other communities on the Reservation.
- We praise God for the increased connections we have with our next door neighbor, Herlinda! She has expressed interest in meeting in our backyard for home church/Bible study. Pray that we can begin meeting regularly with her and her family.

New Prayer Requests:

- We received notification from the renters in our old house that they'll be moving out in July. We have some big decisions to make about this house. Do we relist the house with a realtor? Do we attempt to sell it ourselves? Should we find new long-term renters to live there? Or should we pursue a combination of the above three? Prayers for direction and discernment would be greatly appreciated!!
- The Navajo couple who has been renting our house (Melissa & Mike) are also our friends. Mike is currently in the hospital suffering from medical issues caused by many years of alcohol. The doctors are only giving him several months to live. They're trying to stabilize his body now so that he can go home and live out the remainder of his days in the presence of his family. Pray for this family as they walk through a very dark valley. Pray for our family to have opportunities to love and minister to them during this time. Melissa is a solid believer, we're not sure about Mike's salvation. We're praying that Mike has the chance to repent and turn to Jesus before it's too late.
- A few weeks ago Jason was voted on as a member of our local volunteer fire department. He's been appointed the role of chaplain to serve the 50+ members in our department as well as individuals in our community who need emotional and spiritual support. We see this as a great opportunity to connect with people who are longing for deeper spiritual connections. Pray for Jason to learn his new role quickly so that he can effectively minister to those he comes into contact with.
